



TPN Recovery Program

"A pathway to change"

We must realize that not all men want or are ready for recovery, just because we want them to be. Not all men recover in the same way as we would like them to. It's not just about substance usage, it's emotions, feelings, lack of social skills, structure and of course people, places, and things. There are many pathways to recovery. But, as someone in charge of an addict we lack the time, money, and resources for proper help. We often continue to enable as well as letting the addict continue to do as they wish. It just seems easier at times to give in. The path of lower cost, least resistance, and ease of mind often wins out over doing the right thing. That is one reason why sober living and halfway houses has such a high rate of failure.

TPN uses a Holistic program that builds on the individual progress of treatment by exposing men to a healthy, balanced lifestyle, a strong support group, work ethic, and guidance from those who have walked a similar path. Our approach embraces their emotional, physical, and spiritual wellbeing, as well as psychological, and behavioral growth. Our groups are held internally by credentialed professional, rather than attending the same old AA/NA/CR meetings that have gotten them nowhere in the past. Why continue to do the same old thing, when it is not working? This is often the case because it cost you or the addict the least amount of money!

What we have learned over the past thirty years is it is not about the money. Sometimes you have to pay more to get more. Nothing is free and if it is, what value or worth do you really place on what you received? Recovery is a lifelong process. Few wake up one morning and say I think I'll become an addict. Most wake up one morning to find that they cannot control the cravings, their life is in shambles, and they have hurt all family and friend relationships and they cannot or care about holding down a job. Their only focus is how to get their next fix. By the same token, rarely does an addict wake up one morning and say that's it I'm quitting and stops using without help.

TPN has three locations and programs to help serve the right addict that wants to learn, understand, and live a life of sobriety and recovery. Each house can do that, but it is done in different ways and are set up for men at different stages of recovery and social skills. The main house is located in Purdy Missouri. Those that need the most help, needs to start out here. Clustered between several small towns, it is a two mile walk to the nearest store. Purdy is based on a one-year educational program, that is ran in phases. Here there are paid staff members, a certified Drug and Alcohol counselor on staff. The men are not allowed to come and go as they please. Accountability, learning and one's self and taking responsibility for their actions are key elements in their phase one groups.



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Our second location is located in Monett Missouri. Most of the men here as well as the house manager either graduated from the Purdy house or spent nine months at the Purdy house. If the man is to the point where he can go months without using, but just seems to keep slipping and holding a job, Monett may be where he needs to be. The house manager has an outside job and lives in the house. He is also a graduate of the Purdy program.

It is geared for men secure in their recovery, that are looking to maintain the job they had at the Purdy house. Here they start to fly. They do not have restrictions, other than to be accountable for informing the house manager when they are going to be gone. They are still expected to attend groups as well as house meetings. In these house meeting they talk about the problems or potential problems in the house. Openness is key and if a house member is not living up to the expectations of the other members they can be voted out of the house.

Our third house is located in Joplin Missouri. Here there is a house manger that lives in the house and works full time for TPN. Joplin also has a Drug and Alcohol counselor that does groups and counsels with the men. Until they can get a ride the house members are transported to work. Both internal and external groups as well as weekly house meeting are done. Like the Monett house, members openly talk in house meetings about what may irritate them with other members and well as voting men out of the house.

Members in the TPN program may have options to move from house to house based on their needs and circumstances. TPN does not set a time frame for program length or the time that the men stay in the house. That is up to them or the courts. The Purdy house does have a one-year program.

All house work on the following educations groups

- Individual Counseling • Anger Management • Drug Education
- Structured Environment • Group Therapy • Special needs Counseling
- Behavioral Modification • Life skills training
- Employment/Job Opportunities • 12 step Meetings
- Community Service • GED classes

General cost for each Program are subject to change based off of the number of members, and individual house cost of operations. We are not state or federally funded. Our programs and operational support is based on colleting the funds due from the men in the program.



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TPN understands that cost is important and we try very hard to keep it low. Our question to you is what has the cost of the man's addiction been on himself (mentally, physically, and health), family, and society?
